<u>Saint Francis of Assisi</u> is credited with creating the first live nativity scene in 1223 in order to cultivate the worship of Christ. He himself had recently been inspired by his visit to the <u>Holy Land</u>, where he'd been shown Jesus's traditional birthplace. The scene's popularity inspired communities throughout Catholic countries to stage similar pantomimes.

Finance Message: During this Thanksgiving weekend, we give thanks for your continued financial contributions to the parish.
