
Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament



During his agony in the garden, Jesus asked Peter, "So you could not stay awake with Me for even an hour?" Jesus asks each of us a similar question, are we going to spend a Holy Hour with Him. Jesus is waiting for each of us. As St. Josemaria Escriva said, "Each time you approach the Blessed Sacrament, remember that Jesus has been waiting for you for twenty centuries for this personal visit from you." St. Maximillian Kolbe tells us "Eucharistic adoration is the greatest power in the universe, capable of transforming us and changing the face of the world."

A Holy Hour, which is a form of Eucharistic Adoration, is an opportunity to spend an hour with Jesus. There is a communal prayer and time spent in silence for personal prayer and reflection. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament offers us a time when we can worship the true God in the person of Jesus Christ who is really, truly present, body, blood, soul, and divinity in the Blessed Sacrament. A Holy Hour is the chance to be in the presence of Jesus.

St. Francis of Assisi parish has a Holy Hour every Thursday, from 6:00 to 7:00 PM. If you are unable to attend weekly, or to stay for the whole hour that's fine. Spending 15 or 20 minutes in Eucharistic Adoration, or coming once or twice a month may not seem like much, but remember, Jesus fed a crowd of five thousand with only five loaves and two fish. He can do great things with only small commitment.
